Accommodation

The City of Dresden levy a lodging tax of about 7% of the room price. Business travellers are excluded but need to go through some bureaucratic hassle. Ask your hotel for more information.

Arrival

If you arrive by train or bus, it's recommended to get off at the train station Dresden-Neustadt.

From the airport use the “S-Bahn” (commuter train), starting from the underground station, also to Bahnhof-Neustadt train station (or to Hauptbahnhof).

There aren't many flight connections to the Dresden airport. Suitable alternative airports are:

Airport Berlin-Schönefeld (SXF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Direct bus connections to Dresden with FlixBus or RegioJet (see www.busradar.com) to Dresden; exit at Dresden-Neustadt train station recommended (2 hrs).
Airport Berlin-Tegel (TXL)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train connections from Berlin-Hauptbahnhof; exit at Dresden-Neustadt recommended (2-3 hrs). • Direct bus connections or from Berlin ZOB to Dresden with FlixBus or RegioJet (see www.busradar.com) to Dresden; exit at Dresden-Neustadt train station recommended (3 hrs).
Airport Leipzig/Halle (LEJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train connections from the airport or from Leipzig-Hauptbahnhof; exit at Dresden-Neustadt recommended (1.5-2 hrs.). • Bus connections from Leipzig-Hauptbahnhof to Dresden with FlixBus (see www.busradar.com) to Dresden; exit at Dresden-Neustadt train station recommended (1.5 hrs).
Prague Airport Václav Havel (PRG)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train connections from Prague Main Station (Eurocity trains) every 2 hrs.; recommended exit at Dresden Hauptbahnhof (2.5 hrs). • Bus connection from Prague ÚAN Florenc or Main Station with Regiojet and FlixBus (see www.busradar.com) to Dresden; exit at Dresden-Hauptbahnhof train station recommended (2 hrs).

State Art Collections

Saxon rulers have often been intensive art collectors. The results can be seen in 15 museums in several buildings like Zwinger, Residenzschloss or Albertinum.
